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NEWSLETTER 01

Last year we were very fortunate to secure a grant of £20,000 to enable us to reduce the financial burden for the families who have children at our school.

This allowed us to:

- subsidise all residential visits (£5461.35),
- cover the cost of all class visits and visitors (£5480.75),
- provide free after school clubs (£4600),
- provide music enrichment for the children in Year 5 who all got to learn how to play the guitar (£1550),
- issue each child who would be at our school this September with a free new school polo-shirt and PE top (£2636.97).

We also reduced the cost of school meals from £2.50 to just £1.50 per meal - for all families whose children are not eligible for free school meals. This is something that we have continued this school year.

Last week it was confirmed that the same organisation would be providing the same level of financial support which is something we are extremely grateful for!

We are looking to reinstate the Year 4 & Year 5 residential visit to London (in May 2023) - and we are very much aware that costs associated with fuel, energy, transport, accommodation and food continue to spiral.

Therefore, for this year, we have allocated:

- £11,920 to subsidise the cost of all residential visits. (Our Year 6 families will be aware that we have been reduce the cost of the Year 6 residential from £235 to £135 already this year).
- £5250 to cover the cost of as many educational visits and visitors as we can. (The teaching staff are busy booking experiences for the children in their class - and you will see some of these will be taking place this term. This funding also helped to pay for the transport to/from Chester Zoo for the children in Years 1 to 6 last week).

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If you have a child who went to the zoo, you will soon receive a letter which can be exchanged for a FREE family ticket (2 adults and 3 children) to gain entry to Chester Zoo on any non-school day - between now and 22nd March 2023. We apologise that we are not able to extend this to the children in our Reception class – we did try! If you have more than one child at our school, the letter will be sent home with the eldest child. If these letters get lost or damaged, they cannot be replaced – so please take great care of them. Equally, if you know that you will not use the free pass – or have an annual pass already – please consider returning these to the school, so they can be allocated to another family.

- £2920.93 to employ a play therapist to support those children who need this the most.

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At present, we are also offering a significant number of afterschool clubs for free. This is something that we may not be able to do for much longer - but we do not want to deter any child attending a club that they love and enjoy (so please come to speak with us if the cost ever becomes a barrier for your child to attend).

We still have places in a number of the free after school clubs that are taking place this half term. Please have a look on School Spider to see if there are any that your child could attend.

This year we will also be having a series of Inter-House Sporting Competitions, which will cover:

At present, the Year 6 pupils are considering if they would like to be a Sports House Captain and we have entered a wide range of inter-school competitions throughout the year. The first of these took place last week – and we are very proud of our Year 5 & Year 6 High 5 Netball Team who finished joint second in an inter-house competition held at The Heath School. The players just keep getting better and better and we feel that we will have a very strong High 5 Netball Team ready to compete to win the trophy at the next inter-school competition, next term.
