Gillmoss Recycling Discovery Centre


Even though the weather on Wednesday caused the postponement of the inter-

TALK Halton Communication Hub

There is now a magnificent FREE online resource, called the Talk Halton Communication Hub, which provides lots of information and free resources to help you to support your child on their communication journey.

Whilst some of this is aimed at pre-school aged children, there is a wealth of resources to support older children too.

In addition to Information and Resources, there are sections to help you find out about Support Services, what to do if you have any Concerns and details of Courses and Training to support children's communication.
